

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, §§ 67-7-201 et seq., permits counties, upon two-thirds (2/3) vote of their respective county legislative bodies, to enact a mineral severance tax for the benefit of the county road fund to be administered by the State Department of Revenue; and

WHEREAS, Knox County is in need of additional revenue; and

WHEREAS, the Knox County Commission deems it in the public interest to levy a mineral severance tax in Knox County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY A TWO-THIRDS (2/3) VOTE OF THE COMMISSION OF KNOX COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, §§ 67-7-201 et seq., which authorizes counties to levy a tax on the severance from the earth of sand, gravel, sandstone, chert and limestone, within the boundaries of Knox County, Tennessee, is hereby adopted as authority for the tax levied by Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 2. There is hereby levied a severance tax on the above-named minerals at a rate of fifteen cents (0.15ϕ) per ton.

SECTION 3. The Mineral Severance Tax of Knox County shall be collected by the State Department of Revenue in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Department of Revenue.

SECTION 4. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted immediately upon its passage to the Office of the Secretary of State and to the Department of Revenue of the State of Tennessee and shall be spread upon the record of the county legislative body.

SECTION 5. For purposes of collection, this Resolution shall take effect on the first day of the month occurring at least thirty (30) days after the certified copy is received by the Department of Revenue; for all other purposes it shall be effective upon passage by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the county legislative body of Knox County, as provided by the Charter of Knox County, Tennessee, the public welfare requiring it.
