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2018 Knox County Behavioral Risk Factor Survey

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Introduction

The Knox County Behavioral Risk Factor Survey (BRFS) collected information on the health and health-related behaviors of Knox County's adults (18+ years) in 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, and 2014. This report presents the results of the 2018 Knox County BRFS (n^1 = 3,645 adults) collected from April 2018 to January 2019 by the University of Tennessee Center for Applied Research and Evaluation among non-institutionalized Knox County adults (18+ years) following national BRFS guidelines for sampling. It is modelled closely on the state and national BRFS, the world's largest health survey (CDC, 2019). Data analysis began in April 2019 and was completed in October 2019. The report writing and editing process was completed in April 2021.

Methodology

Previous Knox County BRFS efforts (2002, 2005, 2008 and 2011) used a landline-only survey methodology to collect information. Beginning in 2014 and continued in 2018, the Knox County BRFS used a dual-frame sampling design which incorporates landlines plus cellphones to optimize the collection of reliable and representative data (Hu, Balluz, Battaglia, and Frankel, 2011). Comparisons between the 2014 and 2018 findings with previous survey years (2002, 2005, 2008 and 2011) should be undertaken with caution due to the differences in sampling methodology. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines were closely followed in the collection and analysis of the data. Responses from a total of 3,645 non-institutionalized, non-incarcerated Knox County adults were included in the sample.

Analysis

Results were generated using SAS-callable SUDAAN release 11.03 (Research Triangle Institute, Cary, North Carolina). Demographics were limited to:

- Gender (M/F)
- Age groups (18-24, 25-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64 and 65+)
- Race (non-Hispanic white; non-Hispanic Black; and other race/ethnicity which included Hispanics of any race, Asian Americans, Native Americans, Alaskan Natives or Pacific Islanders)
- Annual household income (less than \$15,000, \$15,000-\$24,999, \$25,000-\$34,999, \$35,000-\$49,999, \$50,000 or greater)
- Education level (less than high school, high school, some college or post-high school education, and college graduates, including education beyond college bachelors)
- Employment (employed, unemployed, homemaker, student, retired, and unable to work)
- Sexual orientation (straight, gay/lesbian, bisexual and any other sexual orientation).²

When possible, the results of the 2018 Knox County BRFS were compared to *Healthy People 2020* objectives to determine how well Knox County is doing in meeting national health objectives set for the year 2020 (Koh, Piotrowski, Kumanyika and Fielding, 2011; ODPHP, 2016). A list of the *Healthy People 2020* objectives which apply to the data in this report is available on page 204. In addition, results from the 2018 Knox County BRFS are compared to results from the Tennessee and United States (USA) Behavioral Risk Factor Surveys (CDC, 2019) in the most recent year available.

Interpretation of confidence intervals and reliability restrictions

All prevalence estimates and averages in the attached tables are presented with 95% confidence intervals (CI). Simply termed "(CI)" in the tables, the 95% CI represents a level of certainty in the analyses. The level of confidence for the analysis has been set at 95%, meaning that if the data collection and analysis could be replicated many times, the confidence intervals should include within it the correct value of the measure 95% of the time (Rothman, 2002). A narrow CI implies a greater precision compared to a wider CI and is most often the result of a larger sample size.


To be confident in the reliability of the results, responses to questions that received fewer than 20 responses were not included in the tables. These non-reported parts of the tables are marked with a single symbol "\footnote{\tau}." In addition, all statistics were subjected to relative standard error (RSE) calculations to check for reliability. Any mean or prevalence estimate that resulted in an RSE estimate of 30.0 or greater could not be reported and has been replaced with "\footnote{\tau}" in the tables. RSE estimates are not reported in the tables but are available upon request from the Knox County Health Department.

SECTION 1: GENERAL HEALTH

Health status

• Slightly more than one out of seven adults (15.4%) reported their general health to be either poor or fair (Table 1; Figure 1). In contrast, most Knox County adults (84.6%) reported they were in either good or excellent general health (Table 2). The 2018 Knox County estimate for fair/poor health of 15.4% was lower than the 2018 estimate for Tennessee at 22.7% (Figure 1).

Poor physical health days

- Among Knox County adults, the average number of poor physical health days in the past 30 days among Knox County adults was estimated at 3.6 days (Table 3). Women reported more average days (4.2 average days) of poor physical health compared to men (3.0 average days). Adults with annual household (HH) incomes less than \$15,000 reported a greater number of average poor physical health days (8.7 average days) during the past 30 days compared to adults with annual HH incomes of \$25,000 or more. In addition, adults with less than a high school education reported a greater number of average poor physical health days (7.6 average days) during the past 30 days compared to all other education levels (Table 3).
- More than one-half of all Knox County adults reported no days of poor physical health or injury (63.1%) (Figure 2, Table 4) during the past 30 days.

Poor mental health days

 Among Knox County adults, the average number of poor mental health days in the past 30 days was 4.9 days (Table 7). Younger adults (ages 18-24) reported an average of 9.5 poor mental health days during the past 30 days. This was a greater estimate than all other age groups (Table 7). In addition, gay/lesbian adults (15.8 average days) and bisexual adults (18.2 average days) reported greater average days of poor mental health in the past 30 days compared to straight adults (4.2 average days) (Table 7).

More than one-half of Knox County adults reported no days of poor mental health (56.7%; Table 8) during the past 30 days (Figure 2).

Figure 2. Prevalence estimate of Knox County adults reporting no days, 1-5 days, or 6-30 days of



Inability to complete normal activities due to poor health

• Knox County adults reported an average of 4.2 days each month in which normal activities could not be completed due to physical or mental health conditions. (Table 11).

Sleep

• The average number of hours Knox County adults reported sleeping during a 24-hour period in 2018 was 6.9 hours (Figure 3; Table 15).


SECTION 2: HEALTH CARE ACCESS

Health insurance


Figure 4. Prevalence estimate of adults who reported they have some form of health care coverage, Knox County 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018; Tennessee, United States 2018

Nine out of 10 Knox County adults (93.4%) reported they have health care coverage/insurance (Figure 4; Table 17). This percentage (93.4%) is greater than the 2018 Tennessee estimate for health insurance of 88.0% (Figure 4). In line with Tennessee and the nation in 2018, Knox County has not met the *Healthy People 2020* AHS-1 objective of 100% of people having health care coverage.

• Ninety-two percent of Knox County adults ages 18-64 (92.0%) reported they have health insurance (Table 18; Figure 5) not yet meeting *Healthy People 2020* objective AHS-1 which calls for 100% of people insured by 2020 (ODPHD, 2016).³ The remaining 8% who reported they lacked health insurance represent an estimated 22,700 adults ages 18-64.

³ Knox County adults ages 18-64 are usually not eligible for Medicare. Figure 4 represents all adults, including those 65+ on Medicare rolls. This is the reason that the Figure 5 estimate for adults (92.0%) covered by health care is lower than the one seen in Figure 4 for all adults (93.4%)




Figure 6. Health care coverage by annual household income among Knox County adults ages 18-64 in 2018: Prevalence estimates

- Health insurance prevalence estimates by annual household income among Knox County adults ages 18-64 are displayed in Figure 6. Adults ages 18-64 with HH incomes of \$50,000 or more (96.7%) are more likely to have health insurance compared to all other HH income groups (Table 18).
- Adults ages 18-64 with college degrees or greater education (96.7%) and employed adults (93.0%) also report having insurance more often compared to other education classes or employment categories (Table 18).
- Healthy People 2020 objective AHS-1 (100% of adults having insurance) has not yet been met for Knox County adults ages 18-64.





Figure 7. Principal form of health care coverage among Knox County adults with insurance in 2018: Prevalence estimates

- As seen in Figure 7, more than half of Knox County adults (54.4%) purchased their health care coverage through their employer (Table 21).

Access to a healthcare provider

Eight out of ten Knox County adults (82.5%) reported they have one or more persons they
consider as their personal doctor or health care provider (Figure 8; Table 22). This is close to
meeting *Healthy People 2020* objective AHS-3 which calls for 83.9% of persons having a
usual primary care provider (ODPHD, 2016).



Cost barriers

• As seen in Figure 9, 11.0% of Knox County adults reported they needed to see a doctor in the past 12 months but could not due to costs (Table 25). The 2018 Knox County estimate of 11.0% is lower than the 2018 Tennessee estimate of 15.8% for this variable.




Figure 10. Prevalence estimate of Knox County adults ages 18-64 with and without health insurance who needed to see a doctor in the past 12 months but could not due to the cost

Among adults ages 18-64 lacking health care coverage, almost one-half (48.8%) reported
they needed to see a doctor in the past year but could not due to cost (Figure 10; Table 27).
This represents approximately 11,000 adults in Knox County. The estimate for this variable
among adults ages 18-64 without health insurance (48.8%) is higher compared to adults
ages 18-64 who have health insurance (9.4%) as seen in Figure 10.


- Seven percent (7.0%) of Knox County adults reported they did not take their medication as prescribed due to costs (Table 28).
- Almost one out of four Knox County adults ages 18-64 who lacked health insurance (24.8%)
 reported they did not take their medication as prescribed due to costs during the past year
 (Table 29).
- One out of five (21.4%) Knox County adults reported they had medical bills that they were paying off over time (Table 30).

Routine health checkups

In 2018, 78.2% of Knox County adults (18+ years) reported they had a routine health checkup within the past 12 months (Figure 11; Table 32). Almost six percent (5.8%) of Knox County adults (an estimated 20,000 adults) reported they have not had a checkup within the past five years or have never had one (Figure 11; Table 35).

Figure 11. Length of time since the last routine health checkup among Knox County adults, 2018: Prevalence estimates




 Among Knox County adults ages 18-64, 74.5% reported they had a routine health checkup during the past 12 months in 2018 (Table 36). Less than half of Knox County adults ages 18-64 who lacked health insurance (45.6%) reported they had a routine health checkup within the past 12 months (Table 37).

Average visits to a health care provider

- On average, Knox County adults visited a doctor, nurse or other health care professional 5.4 times in the past year in 2018 (Table 41; Figure 12).
- Women (6.2 average visits) were more likely to report this behavior compared to men (4.6 average times) (Table 41; Figure 12).
- Non-Hispanic white adults (5.6 average visits) averaged more health care provider visits in the past year compared to non-Hispanic Black adults (4.1 average visits) (Table 41; Figure 12).

Figure 12. Average number of times Knox County adults reported they visited their health care provider during the past year by gender and race/ethnicity, 2018




 Adults ages 18-64 who lacked health insurance averaged 2.1 visits to a health care provider during the past year (Table 42).

Quality of health care


Figure 13. Level of satisfaction with health care among Knox County adults, 2018: Prevalence estimates

• Seven out of ten (71.7%) of Knox County adults reported they were very satisfied with the health care they receive (Figure 13; Table 44). Three out of four (75.8%) Knox County adults with HH income of \$50,000 or more reported they were very satisfied with the health care they receive. Approximately one-half (57.6%) of adults with HH income of less than \$15,000 reported they were very satisfied with their health care (Table 44).

SECTION 3: MENTAL HEALTH, DIFFICULTY CONCENTRATING AND STRESS


Figure 14. Self-reported mental health issues among Knox County adults in 2018: Prevalence estimates

- Approximately nine percent (9.3%) of Knox County adults reported they were always or usually worried or stressed about having enough money to pay the rent or mortgage (Figure 14; Table 48).
- Almost seven percent (6.5%) reported they were always or usually stressed about having enough money to buy nutritious meals (Figure 14; Tables 51).
- One out of seven (15.5%) Knox County adults reported they were currently taking medicine or receiving treatment for any type of mental health condition (Figure 14; Table 54). In contrast, 7.2% of Knox County adults reported they needed mental health treatment or counseling during the past year but did not get it (Figure 14; Table 55).
- Women (19.1%) were more likely to report they were in treatment for mental health conditions compared to men (11.6%) as seen in Table 54.
- Gay or lesbian adults (45.8%) were more likely to report they were in treatment for mental health conditions compared to straight adults (14.8%) (Table 54).
- Adults who reported they were unable to work (47.3%) and unemployed adults (38.4%) reported current mental health treatment more frequently compared to employed adults (13.2%) (Table 54).
- One out of eight Knox County adults (13.3%) reported they have difficulty concentrating, remembering, or making decisions due to physical, mental, or emotional conditions (Figure 14; Table 56). Knox County adults with less than a high school education (36.6%) reported this behavior more frequently compared to adults with some college (13.3%) and adults with college degrees (6.8%) (Table 56). Adults with annual HH incomes of less than \$15,000 (30.0%) reported this behavior more frequently compared to adults with annual HH incomes of \$50,000 or more (6.1%) (Table 56).

Depressive disorders

A depressive disorder is a mood disorder characterized by frequent or constant feelings of sadness/despair and loss of interest in things that were once pleasurable (NIMH, 2018, February). Depressive disorders should not be confused with temporary feelings of sadness.


- One out of four (25.9%) Knox County adults reported they were told by a health professional they have a depressive disorder (Figure 15; Table 57).
- At 32.0%, women were more likely to report having a depressive disorder compared to men (19.3%) as seen in Table 57.
- In addition, adults with less than a high school education (47.1%) were more likely to report they were told they have a depressive disorder compared to adults with college degrees (21.0%) as seen in Table 57.

SECTION 4: CARDIOVASCULAR HEALTH

Lack of exercise


Figure 16. Prevalence estimate of Knox County adults who reported no physical activity outside of work during the past month, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018

- Almost 21 percent of Knox County adults (20.9%) reported they did not participate in any
 form of physical activity outside of work during the past month (Figure 16; Table 59). This
 has met *Healthy People 2020* objective PA-1 which calls for no more than 32.6% of adults
 (ODPHD, 2016) reporting no leisure-time physical activity.
- Women (25.4%) reported a lack of physical activity during the past month more frequently compared to men (16.0%) (Table 59).
- More than half (54.3%) of adults with less than a high school education reported a lack of physical activity outside of work more often than those of other education levels (Table 59).

Hypertension

 One out of three (34.9%) Knox County adults reported they had been diagnosed with hypertension (high blood pressure). This excludes pregnancy-related hypertension, borderline hypertension or temporary forms of the condition (Figure 17; Table 60).



- Knox County adults ages 55-64 (54.2%) and in the 65+ age range (65.9%) reported having been diagnosed with high blood pressure more frequently compared to all younger age groups (Table 60).
- More than one-half of retired adults (65.0%) and adults who were unable to work (66.3%) reported they had high blood pressure (Table 60).
- Almost three out of four (73.5%) Knox County adults with high blood pressure reported they were currently taking medications for their condition (Table 61).

Heart attack, angina, stroke

- In 2018, almost four percent (3.9%) of Knox County adults reported they were diagnosed with a heart attack (Figure 18; Table 62). This represents approximately 14,000 adults.
- Knox County adults with less than a high school education reported they were diagnosed with a heart attack more frequently (9.3%) compared to adults with college degrees (2.6%) (Table 62).
- Adults with annual HH incomes of less than \$15,000 (7.5%) reported having had a heart attack more frequently than adults with HH incomes greater than \$50,000 (2.4%) (Table 62).
- In 2018, 3.6% of adults reported they had been diagnosed with a stroke. This represents approximately 12,700 adults (Figure 18; Table 63).
- One out of ten (10.4%) Knox County adults ages 65+ reported they have had a stroke (Table 63).
- In 2018, 4.6% of Knox County adults reported they had been diagnosed with angina or coronary heart disease (CHD). This represents approximately 16,000 Knox County adults (Figure 18, Table 64).
- One out of seven (15.6%) Knox County residents ages 65+ reported having been diagnosed with angina or CHD (Table 64).




SECTION 5: DIABETES AND KIDNEY DISEASE

Diagnosed with diabetes

- Reports of diabetes diagnosed among Knox County adults have been increasing since 2002 (Figure 19). The 2002 estimate for diabetes diagnoses among adults was 7.1% which increased to 11.2% by 2018, an increase of 55%. The 11.2% estimate in 2018 represented approximately 40,000 Knox County adults (Table 65).
- The average age at diagnosis of diabetes among Knox County adults was 47.4 years in 2018 (Table 66).

• Almost one out of six Knox County adults with diabetes (16.1%) reported they had been diagnosed with retinopathy (Table 73).

Diabetes management

- Almost one out of three (29.8%) diabetic adults in Knox County reported they use insulin to control their diabetes (Figure 20; Table 69).
- Almost nine out of ten Knox County adults with diabetes (89.3%) reported they saw a health care professional specifically for diabetes within the past year (Figure 20; Table 70).
- Nine out of ten Knox County adult diabetics (94.4%) reported they have had at least one A1C test during the past three months (Figure 20; Table 71).
- Three out of four Knox County adults with diabetes (75.0%) reported they had a dilated eye examination during the past 12 months (Figure 20; Table 72).

Kidney disease

• Almost five percent (4.7%) of Knox County adults reported they had been diagnosed with kidney disease (Table 74).

SECTION 6: ORAL HEALTH

Dental visits






Figure 22. Prevalence estimate of Knox County adults who reported they saw a dentist for any reason during the past 12 months, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018

- Seven out of ten Knox County adults (71.3%) reported they visited their dentist for any reason during the past 12 months in 2018 (Figures 21 and 22; Table 75).
- Almost eleven percent of adults (10.6%) reported they had not visited a dentist for five or more years or had never visited a dentist (Figure 21; Table 78). This represented approximately 37,500 Knox County adults.

Figure 21. Length of time since their last visit to a dentist (for any reason) among Knox County adults in 2018: Prevalence estimates

• One out of three Knox County adults (36.5%) reported they had at least some permanent teeth removed because of tooth decay or gum disease, excluding injury or orthodontics (Tables 79, 81, 82, and 83).

Figure 23. Number of permanent teeth removed due to tooth decay or gum disease among Knox County adults, 2018: Prevalence estimates




SECTION 7: TOBACCO USE

Cigarette smoking

- Fifteen percent (15.0%) of Knox County adults reported they smoke cigarettes some days or every day (current smokers) (Figure 24; Table 84). This has yet to meet *Healthy People 2020* objective TU-1.1 which calls for no more than 12.0% of adults smoking (ODPHD, 2016).
- Cigarette smoking among Knox County adults has seen a 41.4% decline from 2002 (25.6%) to 2018 (15.0%) as seen in Figure 24. At 15.0%, the 2018 estimate for Knox County adult smokers was lower than the 2018 estimate for adult smokers in Tennessee (20.7%).

- Approximately one out of five Knox County adults (22.9%) reported they used to smoke but no longer do so (Table 86).
- More than one-half of Knox County adults (60.4%) who smoke reported they stopped smoking for one or more days in the past 12 months trying to quit permanently (Table 87). This has yet to meet *Healthy People 2020* objective TU4.1 which calls for an increase in cessation attempts among adult smokers in the past 12 months to 80% (ODPHD, 2016).

Smokeless tobacco use

More than four percent (4.4%) of Knox County adults reported they use smokeless tobacco products, such as chewing tobacco, snuff or snus every day or some days (Table 88). This has yet to meet *Healthy People 2020* objective TU-1.2 which calls for no more than 0.2% of adults using these products. More men (7.4%) reported this behavior compared to women (1.6%) (Table 88).

E-cigarette/Electronic vapor product use


- Almost one out of four Knox County adults (23.2%) reported they have tried e-cigarettes or electronic vapor products (Table 89).
- One out of 20 Knox County adults (5.1%) reported they use e-cigarettes or electronic vapor products on some days or every day (current users) (Table 91).
- Adults with college degrees (2.3%) were less likely to report they currently use these products compared to adults with less education (Table 91).

SECTION 8: ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG USE

Current alcohol use

- Forty-five percent (45.0%) of Knox County adults reported they had one or more drinks of alcohol during the past 30 days (Figure 25; Table 92).
- Other race/ethnicity adults which include Hispanics of any race (29.4%) reported a lower current alcohol use compared to white (non-Hispanic) adults (46.3%) (Table 92).
- Adults with annual HH incomes of \$50,000 or greater (55.2%) reported this behavior more than adults with annual HH incomes of \$35,000 or less (Table 92).
- College graduates (53.0%) reported current alcohol use more than adults with high school degrees (29.5%) or adults with less than high school degrees (28.9%) (Table 92).


Figure 26. Prevalence estimate of adults reporting heavy alcohol use, Knox County, 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018; Tennessee, United States, 2018

• In 2018, 6.2% of Knox County adults were defined as heavy drinkers based on the survey questions (Figure 26; Table 93).

Binge drinking

Binge drinking is defined by the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) as five or more drinks on one occasion for men, and four or more drinks on one occasion for women (NIAAA, 2004, Winter).

- There were 15.2% of Knox County adults engaging in binge drinking within the month prior to taking the survey (Figure 27; Table 94).
- At 15.2%, Knox County met *Healthy People 2020* objective SA-14.3 which calls for no more than 24.2% of adults reporting binge drinking (ODPHD, 2016).
- Men (18.8%) were more likely to report binge drinking compared to women (11.8%) (Table 94).







Influenza


- One-half of Knox County adults (50.2%) reported they received an influenza vaccine within the past 12 months in 2018 (Figure 30; Table 100). This has not yet met *Healthy People* 2020 objective IID-12.12 which calls for 70.0% of all adults (18+) receiving an annual flu vaccination.
- More non-Hispanic white adults (51.8%) compared to non-Hispanic African American adults (37.2%) reported they received influenza immunizations during the past year (Table 100).









- More adults ages 65+ reported they received pneumococcal pneumonia shots in Knox County (84.1%) compared to adults ages 65+ in Tennessee (74.5%) (Figure 33).


One out of five (21.3%) Knox County adults ages 18-49 reported that they had a HPV vaccination (approximately 41,000 adults) (Table 104). Among those adults who had the vaccination, 84.7% reported they had two or more doses (Table 105).⁴



- Among adults, there were more women (39.1%) at self-reported healthy weight compared to men (25.5%) (Table 106).

- As seen in Table 107, more than one out of three Knox County adults (35.8%) were overweight (25.0-29.9 BMI). More men (42.6%) were in this weight class compared to women (29.3%) (Table 107).

Healthy People 2020 objective NWS-8 calls for an increase of adults ages 20+ at a healthy weight (less than 25.0 BMI) to 33.9%. In 2018, 31.9% of Knox County adults were at healthy weight. This objective was close to being met. The 2018 healthy weight estimate for adults ages 20+ was not included in the tables of this report.





Figure 37. Prevalence estimate of obese adults (30.0 BMI or greater), Knox County 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018; Tennessee, United States, 2018



• Almost one out of three Knox County adults (31.7%) were obese (30.0 BMI or greater) (Figure 34 and Figure 37; Table 108). There has been a 50.2% increase in obese adults in Knox County during the 17-year span between 2002 (21.1%) and 2018 (31.7%) (Figure 37).

 Healthy People 2020 objective NWS-9 calls for a decrease in obesity among adults ages 20+ to 30.5%. At 32.4% in 2018, this objective was close to being met by Knox County adults ages 20+.5


Falls

- Among adults ages 65+ who fell in the past year, 40.4% reported an injury from the fall that limited their regular activities for at least one day (Table 112).

Seatbelt use


- Nine out of ten Knox County adults (90.5%) reported they always wear a seatbelt when they are driving or riding in a car (Figure 38; Table 113).
- Almost two percent of Knox County adults (1.9%) reported they seldom or never wear their seatbelts when driving (Figure 38; Table 115). This represents approximately 6,600 adults.
- Healthy People 2020 objective IVP-15, which calls for an increase to 92.0% of motor vehicle drivers and right-front passengers using safety belts by 2020, was almost met among Knox County adults in 2018 (ODPHD, 2016) as seen in Figure 39.



- Retired adults (25.6%) and adults ages 65+ (26.7%) reported greater estimates for this skin cancer diagnoses compared to other groups (Table 117).


Figure 40. Prevalence estimate of adults who reported they were told they had skin cancer, Knox County 2014, 2018; Tennessee, United States, 2018






Figure 43. Prevalence estimate of women ages 50-74 who reported they had a mammogram during the past two years, Knox County, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018; Tennessee, United States, 2018



Figure 45. Prevalence estimate of Knox County women who reported they had a human papillomavirus (HPV) test, 2018






SECTION 14: MEN'S HEALTH

Prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test for prostate cancer

A PSA test is a blood test which checks for prostate cancer by measuring an enzyme called prostatespecific antigen produced by the prostate (CDC, 2019).⁶

- As seen in Table 125 and Figure 48, more than one-half of Knox County men ages 40+ (58.2%) reported that their health care provider had discussed the advantages of a PSA test with them, and almost one-third reported their provider discussed the disadvantages of the test (31.3%) (Figure 48; Table 126).
- More than one-half of Knox County men ages 40+ (54.9%) reported that their health care provider recommended they have a PSA test (Figure 48; Table 127).

Figure 49. Percent of Knox County men ages 40+ reporting they had a PSA test, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018





Figure 50. Percent of men ages 40+ reporting they had a PSA test during the past two years, Knox County 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018; Tennessee, United States, 2018



Home blood stool tests

A home blood stool test checks for hidden blood in your stool (feces). In some cases (not always), this may result from the presence of cancer in the colon or rectum (USPS Task Force, 2016, June).


Figure 51. Knox County adults ages 50+ who reported they used a home blood stool kit to test for colorectal cancer during the past two years, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018: Prevalence estimates

• In 2018, 19.1% of Knox County adults ages 50+ reported they used a home blood stool test during the past two years (Figure 51; Table 132). As seen in Figure 51, this behavior among Knox County adults has seen a 44.6% reduction in the ten-year span from 2008 (34.5%) to 2018 (19.1%).




Figure 53. Percent of adults ages 50+ who reported they have not had a colorectal exam during the past ten years, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2018

- More Knox County adults ages 18-64 (41.0%) have been tested for HIV compared to Tennessee adults in the same age group (37.3%) as seen in Figure 54.
- Five percent of Knox County adults ages 18-64 (5.2%) reported they engage in one or more HIV risk behaviors including: intravenous drug use; STD exposure/treatment; giving or receiving money for drugs in exchange for sex; or having anal sex without a condom (Table 138).

Hepatitis C diagnosis

• Approximately 4,500 Knox County adults (1.3%) reported they have been diagnosed with hepatitis C (Table 139).

<u>Difficulties in everyday activities</u>


- Having trouble hearing was reported at its highest levels among adults ages 65+ (22.3%) and retired adults (21.6%) (Table 140).
- Six percent of Knox County adults (6.3%) reported they had trouble seeing even when they wore glasses (Figure 55; Table 141). Ten percent of Knox County adults ages 65+ (10.1%) reported problems seeing even with their glasses (Table 141).
- More women (8.6%) reported having trouble seeing compared to men (3.9%) (Table 141).
- Adults with less than a high school education (24.4%) reported having trouble seeing more than all other education groups (Table 141).
- Almost 15% of Knox County adults (14.5%) reported they have difficulty walking or climbing stairs (Figure 55; Table 142). Almost one out of three adults ages 65+, or 32.9%, reported having problems walking or climbing stairs (Table 142).
- Slightly more than 3% of Knox County adults (3.1%) reported they have difficulty dressing or bathing (Figure 55; Table 143). Seven percent of Knox County adults ages 65+ (7.0%) reported they have this problem.
- More than 6% of Knox County adults (6.5%) reported they have difficulty doing errands such as going on a doctor's visit or shopping (Figure 55; Table 144). More than one out of eight (13.5%) Knox County adults ages 65+ reported they have this problem (Table 144).


Figure 56. Difficulties hearing, seeing, walking/climbing stairs, dressing/bathing, or doing errands reported by Knox County senior adults ages 65+ in 2018: Prevalence estimates

- More women (9.0%) compared to men (4.9%) reported at least one of these respiratory conditions in 2018 (Table 145).
- Adults with less than a high school education (23.6%) reported at least one or more of the following conditions: COPD, emphysema, or chronic bronchitis more frequently compared to all other education levels (Table 145).


Figure 57. Percent of Knox County adults who reported they had current asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), arthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, gout, lupus, or fibromyalgia, 2018

- More than out one out of four (27.8%) Knox County adults in 2018 reported they were told by a health professional they had at least one of the following: arthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, gout, lupus, or fibromyalgia (Figure 57; Table 146).
- A greater proportion of Knox County women (32.0%) reported at least one or more of the following health conditions: arthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, gout, lupus, or fibromyalgia more often compared to men (23.3%) (Table 146).
- Almost one out ten Knox County adults (9.9%) reported they currently have asthma (Figure 57; Table 147). More Knox County women (13.6%) reported they currently have asthma compared to men (5.9%) in 2018 (Table 148).

- Almost one-half of Knox County adults (47.8%) report their neighborhood has trails, greenways, bike paths or sidewalks for walking, biking or other activities (Table 149).
- Close to one-half of Knox County adults who have trails, greenways, bike paths or sidewalks in their neighborhoods (45.9%) reported they use them once per week but 24.6% never use them (Tables 150-153).
- Senior adults ages 65+ (41.7%) are more likely to report they never use their neighborhood walking/riding paths compared to all other age groups (Table 153).

Figure 58. Frequency of use of neighborhood trails, greenways, bike paths or sidewalks among Knox County adults who have them in 2018




