Mayor Jacobs Talks Vols, New Criminal Court Clerk’s Initiative, and More

KNOXVILLE, Tenn.— During his Weekly Update, which will post around 1 p.m. today, Knox County Mayor Glenn Jacobs talks about the Tennessee Vols, a new Knox County Criminal Court Clerk’s Office initiative, and events he attended.

On Wednesday, Mayor Jacobs proclaimed March 27 as Tennessee Ice Vols Day in recognition for their Division II College Hockey South Championship win.

He also brags about the University of Tennessee men’s basketball team. “Out of the eight SEC teams that punched their tickets to March Madness, only UT and Alabama remain,” Mayor Jacobs says. “Good luck to the Vols. ‘Bama...well, maybe not so much.”
