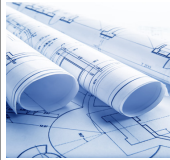
Applying for a Permit

Recreational FIREPITS

The calendar is moving quickly towards the time of year when we will enjoy the fall colors, sports and outdoor firepits. We want to provide you with some safety guidelines for firepit usage to ensure a safe and fun outdoor experience.

The total fuel area should be 3 feet or less in diameter and 2 feet or less in height and is typically used for pleasure, religious, ceremonial, cooking, warmth or similar purposes. Recreational fires shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material. Conditions which could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition. Recreational fires shall be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher complying with a minimum 4-A rating or other approved on-site fire extinguishing equipment, such as dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose or water truck, shall be available for immediate utilization.
